BETTER AT HOME

Offers non-medical services for Tri-Cities seniors 65+

Tri-Cities Better at Home helps seniors with simple day-to-day tasks, thereby helping them maintain their independence and stay connected with their community. The program offers specific non-medical services to seniors who are:

- 65 years old or older
- Residents of Tri-Cities
- Living in their own home

About the program:

- ✓ Pre-registration is required.
- ✓ Light housekeeping and transportation to doctor's appointments services are provided for a fee based on household income.

Tri-Cities Better at Home does NOT provide assistance with home support such as caregiving, personal hygiene, physical mobility, medical needs, meal preparation, pet bathing, yard work or snow removal.

Tri-Cities Better at Home Services



Light Housekeeping

A contracted housekeeper will perform light housekeeping services on behalf of the Tri-Cities Better at Home. Cleaning supplies and equipment including a vacuum must be provided by the senior.

There maybe a wait list for the subsidized housekeeping service.



Friendly Visiting

Volunteers visit and/or call seniors in their home on a regular basis for companionship to help reduce isolation.



Transportation

Using their own vehicle, volunteer drivers provide seniors with transportation to their doctor's appointments across Metro Vancouver. Parking costs are paid by the senior.

- * Only foldable assistive equipment such as walkers/mobility aids may be transported in the volunteer's car. If a senior needs assistance using assistive equipment (such as wheelchairs), he/she will need to be accompanied by a relative or a friend.

Our volunteer drivers are not trained to assist with devices that require specific knowledge such as oxygen cylinders, etc.



Grocery Shopping

Volunteers call seniors to get their grocery orders and enter them into the store's website. The store delivers the orders for a fee.



Food Support

Volunteer drivers deliver food hampers to seniors who are accessing the Tri-Cities Food Bank and have severe mobility challenges.
