Supporting the non-medical needs of older adults in B. C.



United Way helping seniors remain independent.

Tri-Cities Better at Home helps seniors with simple day-to-day tasks, thereby helping them maintain their independence and stay connected with their community.

The program offers specific non-medical services to seniors who are:

- \Rightarrow 65 years old or older
- ⇒ Residents of Tri-Cities
- \Rightarrow Living in their own home (to be eligible for all services)

Tri-Cities Better at Home offers light housekeeping, minor home repair, grocery shopping, transportation to doctor's appointments, food support, and friendly visiting services.

- Pre-registration is required.
- Fees for Better at Home services are determined on a sliding scale based on the senior's household income.
- Light housekeeping , transportation to doctor's appointments, and minor home repair services are provided to seniors living in their own home (not in assisted living or retirement community) for a fee based on household income.

Tri-Cities Better at Home Services

ight Housekeeping

A contracted housekeeper will perform light housekeeping services on behalf of the Tri-Cities Better at Home. Cleaning supplies and equipment including a vacuum must be provided by the senior.

There is a wait list for the subsidized housekeeping service. Seniors who want to be included in the waitlist are encouraged to contact the office.

inor Home Repair

Volunteer Handy Helpers perform specific, minor house repair tasks

in senior's homes. A waiver signed by the senior is needed.

riendly Visiting

Volunteers visit and/or call seniors in their home on a regular basis for companionship to help reduce isolation.

ransportation

Using their own vehicle, volunteer drivers provide seniors with transportation to their doctor's appointments across Metro Vancouver. Parking and toll expenses are paid by the senior. Only foldable assistive equipment such as walkers/mobility aids may be transported in the volunteer's car. If a senior needs assistance using assistive equipment (such as wheelchairs), he/she will need to be accompanied by a relative or friend.

Our volunteer drivers are not trained to assist with devices that require specific knowledge such as oxygen cylinders, etc.

ood Support
